M'Hammer Industries Opens in SE Corner of 209

Being a champion of mom and pop stores, 109 has ejected offers from various chain stores—- McDonald's, Chipotle, Home Depot, to name a few, to open up within its borders. However, even past attempts at family-owned businesses ended up failing, until now.

In January 2016, M'Hammer Industries, led by CEO Miller Hollinger, opened for business in the SE corner of 209. M'Hammer is a blacksmithing company that specializes in weaponmaking but also produces trinkets such as bracelets and necklaces. All products are made with cardboard and other non-lethal materials.
